



The Business Administration Society is the current holder of the tender to operate the store which is located in Room E-126 next to the Nugget Newspaper Office.

Used textbooks are sold for the students on a consignment basis for approximately 80% of their list price value. Anyone wishing to sell their books is welcome to bring them to the store as soon as possible since the books sell most rapidly in the fall.

Other articles available include NAIT-crested jackets, combination locks, sweatshirts (NAIT-crested or plain), sweat suits, gym shorts, T-shirts, gym socks, KEDS running shoes, lab coats, NAIT crests and beer mugs, playing cards, ping pong balls,

pens and personal items such as shampoo, kleenex, panty hose, etc. Prices are either slightly lower or the same as retail. Campus Kits will not be available until January and will be sold for 35¢ as were last year. It is expected that magazines, records and tapes will be available sometime in late fall. Physical Education

The Physical Education service program for all first year Technology and Business students covers a wide scope of activities to meet the needs and interests of these students. Many of the courses offered are orientated toward developing skill in a life time sport or recreation. Others place emphasis on one's knowledge of physical fitness and its significance to one's daily living pattern. It is felt that these activities provide an outlet from student's schedule of classroom lectures and labs. This is one reason why the program is also available to any senior students who want activity.

A few of the more popular and interesting courses that have been offered by the Physical Education Department are badminton, archery, yoga, skiing, camping and survival skills, bridge and curling.

The first year students are given the opportunity to choose the activities they want to take for their physical education credit. The selection of activities for the first quarter will take place during physical education registration in the gymnasium. It commences September 8th and coincides with the P.E. marked on your class timetable.

Intramural activities are also open to both males and females in all technologies. These activities range from golf to soccer, wrestling, bowling, archery, etc. An intramural board is positioned outside of room E 134 and starting dates of each of the activities is posted. The first women's activity will be mini-golf, which will start on September 25th. The first men's activity will be golf Mrs. Collister and will start of September 18th. Instructor


